- To create business and industry interest among them.

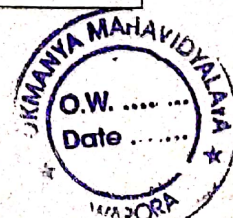
#### The Context:-

The number of girl students in the college is above 75%. Therefore, this practice was organized for them. Keeping in view the increasing incidents of violence against women, students were given training to protect themselves from sudden violence / attack. Secondly, to elevate them from their destitute situations to enable them to stand on their own feet by learning business skills. Small businesses like cake-making, Mehandi-drawing, candle making, paper-envelop making, mask making, sewing, computer skills etc will make them earn enough money to support their family and elevating their living standard.

**The Objective**

- To communicate new CBCS pattern and new syllabus to the concerned teaching fraternity.
- To enhance skills of students.





- To discuss up-downs in Indian economy.
- For faculty improvement.
- To discuss and find out solutions over the contemporary issues in society and Academics.
- To explore the issues in presence of stakeholders to improve their research attitude, rationality and logicity.
- Another objective was to utilize the lockdown period of COVID19 pandemic situation when all world was locked down.

### The Context

CBCS pattern and new syllabus (English, Marathi, Sociology, History and Political Science) University Level Workshops were organized to introduce changes in pattern and syllabus. In the backdrop of demonetization, it was need to speak about changes in Indian economy. During COVID19 period, the world was stopped still. It required the innovations in communicating issues and their possible solutions to the stakeholders. The time also helped the staff to sharpen the knowledge and application of technology. In such context, all the teaching faculty came forward to organize Online National-level Seminars/ Conferences.

### The Practice

- Offline one-day university-level workshops on CBCS and New syllabus of English, Marathi, Sociology, History and Political Science were organised by respective departments on 09 August 2017. More than 200 teaching faculty were benefited by these workshops.
- On 21 December 2019, One-day National seminar (Offline) was organized by Department of Economics on "Indian Economy: Condition and Direction" in which 153 research papers were presented and published in Peer Reviewed Multidisciplinary International e-Research Journal (Research Journey: ISSN – 23487143) with impact factor 6.261.
- Department of Sociology organized Online National Webinars on "Impact of COVID19 on Indigenous People in India" and more than 2100 stakeholders attended it on 6 June 2020.
- On 24/062020, IQAC organized Online National Webinar on "Techniques of Acquiring API Score and Submitting PBAS for University / College Teachers" and more than 3000 participants attended it.
- Department of Political Science organized Online National Webinar on "Impact of COVID19 on Indian Federation" and 1384 participants attended it on 27 June 2020.
- IQAC organized Online National Webinar on "Intellectual Property Rights" on 02 July 2020 and more than 600 participants attended it.
- National e-seminar was organized by the Department of Economics on "Self Reliant India: Opportunities and challenges" held on 02 June 2021. And on this topic we received 86 Research papers from all the corners in India And 156 students, teachers and research scholars virtually attended it.





- National e-seminar was organized by the Department of History on the “Recent trends in Modern History”. It was held on 05 June 2021. We received 106 Research papers on this topic and nearly 192 students, teachers and research scholars virtually participated in it from all over India.
- National e-Conference was organized by the Department of English on the “Recent Trends in Creative Writing”. It was held on 07 June 2021. We received 52 Research papers and 71 people participated in it from all over India.
- National e-seminar was organized by the Department of Political Science on the “Contemporary Indian Foreign Policy: Special Reference to SAARC”. It was held on 09 June 2021. We received 53 research papers and 196 people participated in it from all over India.
- National e-seminar was organized by the Department of Physical Education and Sports on the “Effects of Corona Pandemic on Various Sports Sectors”. It was held on 12 June 2021. We received 78 research papers and 155 people participated in it from all over India.
- National e-seminar was organized by the Department of Marathi on the “Samakalin Marathi Sahitya: Chintan and Chikitsa.” It was held on 24 June 2021. We received 57 research papers and 112 people participated in it from all over India.
- National e-seminar was organized by the Department of Sociology on the “Tribal Society in Contemporary India: Issues, Problem and Remedies”. It was held on 26 June 2021. We received 142 research papers and 200 people participated in it from all over India.
- National e-seminar was organized by the Department of Library on “Issue of Information Technology in library Services”. It was held on 28 June 2021. We received 57 research papers and 96 people participated in it from all over India.


### **Evidence of Success**

Workshop/Seminars/Conferences on various topics were organized online by the college to get the latest information to the research Scholars, students etc. Therefore, they developed a passion for research. About 10,000 scholars and students were benefited from these (Online/offline) seminars.

### **Problems Encountered and Resources Required**

We had some limitations in conducting online e-seminars. The main problem was of network / Internet connectivity in rural areas. Availability of the best resource persons and their extravagant remunerations were also encountered while organizing these Weninars / Conferences. For offline seminars, college did not receive any grant from UGC, since it stopped such provisions. College had to bear all the expenses.
